As we forgive those who trespass against us... Lord's Prayer

Ah, a moment has arrived in my life to practice what I preach. As you know, my little, red car was stolen, it was taken a few days after my wallet and keys were stolen.

Both of these events happened in our driveway; one during the day, and one at night. I am much more shaken up about that, than the car. I am bummed about my car, and it definitely makes my life inconvenient, but there is an unsettling space within me of the trespassing.

After hours of phone calls to various agencies, I finally had a chance to sit still. I put on my "pastor hat" and asked myself what I would say to someone else in this situation. I had many thoughts: thoughts about calming down, taking deep breaths, being thankful that it wasn't worse etc., but eventually, my pastor-self said, "forgive."

We hear the word "forgive" often and it is a big topic in seminary. I also did public speaking on forgiveness, and certainly, I have preached on it.

Today, I can forgive, but I am aware that there might be days when this will re-surface and I will have to go through the act of forgiveness again. Forgiveness isn't always a one-and-done; it is something that gets easier each time we work through it... but not always.

Our call is to forgive when we can and try again (and again) where we cannot. With Jesus, we end up in a cycle of forgiveness. Jesus forgives from the cross and forgives our sins, and then we must find a way to forgive others the way we were forgiven. Some days this is too hard, too fresh; but you come back to the cross and try again tomorrow.

In Jesus' name, Amen.

Meeting recessed for budget development

#### Re-convened meeting at 8:10pm

Goal is to move money out of Designated Funds that were miscellaneous and into the budget it was designated for. This will reduce our designated funds footprint in keeping with our non-profit status. Eliminated Care Team as pastor is visiting Homebound and anyone requesting a visit. Merged Custodial supplies and maintenance as the Duct Tape does both. Developed a separate Capital Improvement budget for large improvements, large maintenance, and large capital outlay. Starting with \$1,033.55 from portable rest room that is not feasible and \$3,000 Rummage sale proceeds. (Note: Will ask council for an electronic vote to move the remaining sum in savings from the sale of the north property to this account. This will begin to cover cost of the building painting.) 
