I hope that this month you are able to take out some purposeful time to do those things where prayerful conversation pours forth from your heart. I hope you find the time to praise the Lord. There are so many things going on in life that it is easy to get swept up into other things.

Even if you have a habit of praying always, carving out a purposeful time, to place yourself into a purposeful posture can be like a breath of fresh air. It is just a way of saying it is time to talk to the Lord now and saying, "Lord, here I am. I am ready." If you ever desire that space to be here at Bethany, you are welcome any time we are here to come in and pray.

June Emergency Fund: Family Promise

Our local Family Promise is housed in the former Presbyterian church across from the Kelso Post office. There are homeless families with children residing there, while the children attend school and the parents work either on preparing and getting jobs or on expanding their earning so they can move into a residence. Staff not only provides counseling, goal setting/progress monitoring, parenting skills, anger management, and a wide variety of services depending on the family needs. Many of these families when they graduate qualify for Habitat Homes, etc.

In addition to families living on site, there are several other families hoping to qualify to move in when space is available. In some cases, they may be living in motels, spare space in friends' or families' houses, or in vans. Help you provide for this vital program helps families who have the greatest chance of getting back on their feet. Please mark your check, "June Emergency Fund" in the memo and mail/ drop it off in the plate in the back of the sanctuary.



Council Meeting Minutes – Thursday, May 11,2023 5:30p.m.

Attendance – Phyllis Cavens, Beth Grambo, George Obermeyer, Tori Gosch, Pastor Susan Dollinger, and Barbara Clausen; Absent-Joyce Croy and Barb Wilson. Guest: Carol Thompson

Devotions and Prayer – Phyllis Cavens inspired us with 1 Peter 1:2-6 **Call to Order and President's Report** – Barbara Clausen called the meeting to order at 5:45pm.

Carol Thompson requested to address the council as incoming co-chair of Duct Tape. Helpers have dwindled to 2-3 people and the building cannot be maintained and the altar care completed with this level of support. The Executive Committee will examine the budget for approximately \$300 per month to see if we cannot get someone to clean twice a month for 4 hours and Duct Tape to cover the inside needs on the other two weeks. (This will mean some areas of the existing budget must be cut.) Carol will provide a list of what needs to be done and a rotating basis of some items can be determined. Consensus was reached on this plan.

April 2023 budget offerings of \$12,045.00 exceeded April 2023 budget expenses of \$11,555.63 by \$489.37. Designated Funds / Savings as of April 30 are \$ 38,108.64.

YTD expenses of \$ 48,921.21 exceed YTD offerings of \$ \$47,913.42 by \$1,007.79.

April 2022 YTD budget offerings were \$43,941.00 and expenses were \$42,947.63.

Request consideration of moving Sunday service to 10:00 It was moved & seconded to include this question as part of the congregational survey on Mother's Day. Motion carried. (Member input for online will be requested.)

- Holy Week went well: Maundy Thursday and Good Friday were nice services. We had a small attendance on Thursday and a good turnout on Friday from both Trinity and Bethany. Pastor Craig and Pastor Susan both took roles, and the music was beautiful. The sanctuary was almost haunting as people sang "Were you there." Both Music and Worship and also the Zoomies miss Roger Lee.
- The guest musician was fantastic. Lasana Kanneh shared his testimony and brought his own equipment. Online could hear his music but not his testimony. (We need to remember that speakers/presenters need to be on the house mics.) We also had 10 people on Zoom, and because Pastor Susan was running a separate camera for FB, she is aware that there were also two people on FB live.
- Youth/Service Small Seeds/Sprouts meet-June3 with service June 4

The children helped lead the Palm Sunday processional. Earth Day with Columbia Heights was a wonderful experience with 26 children coming to Bethany. The Mother's Day Project at Lexington Elementary had 6 children. Both projects included making a card and potting a flower.

Duct Tape Crew – Rick Loewen

Walk Through tours-completed with Rick and scheduling Dave/Carol

This is Rick's last D.T. report to council as he is moving to Eliseo, retirement community, in Tacoma Wednesday May 17th. Dave Foslien and Carol Thompson have volunteered to be co-chairs of the building and grounds committee.

- Rick has greatly enjoyed his involvement and will miss the 2-week-old donuts he loves. Alex Jessen is <u>done painting</u> the outside west wall. Check it out. It looks nice.
- We have finished repairing the women's restroom wall.
- All the outside <u>doors</u> now have <u>security devices</u>. 3 have leather belts and 2 will have wire rope loops to hook to lag bolts.
- Time permitted us to adjust and install 3 new <u>ceiling tiles in the portable</u>. There are quite a few more yet to change out and /or adjust.
- We've been working on <u>lawns and weeds</u> as weather permits.
- The 2 bar <u>lights over the kitchen center</u> counter now work with a new wireless switch on the wall and a receiver in the attic.
- Council should consider <u>selling the property</u> bordering Columbia Heights Road. It is a separate plot from what the church sits on and is taxed. It is being graciously mowed by Michael, the next-door neighbor, for \$20 gas money per month during the growing season. What happens when he can't mow it anymore? Before he volunteered to mow it we would hire it tractor-mowed once or twice a year whether it needed it or not.
- We moved the <u>PowerPoint wall</u> presentation up about 8 inches so it can be seen better.
- <u>Remember</u>, "silence is golden" and "duct tape is silver". Rick will be missed!
- The council by consensus decided to ask Rick and Dave to find out the cost and get the building on painter Alex's summer calendar for possibly half of the north wall and all of the south wall to be paid from our Capital Improvements budget.
- **Women's Bible Study** Studying Intergenerational Promised Salvation (*Gathering* Mag)
- Education Book of Ruth June 2 & 9 on zoom and June 4 & 11 in person on Sundays.

Minister's Report – Pastor Susan

- April was a full month. Maundy Thursday had a small attendance but was a lovely service and Good Friday was held with Trinity. Pastor Craig and I both took roles in it and had a fairly decent attendance. The music was beautiful and fit the mood. Easter was followed immediately by Pastor Roger Lee's death and memorial. The month ended with a wonderful mini WELCA retreat (blue sky and all), and a packed full synod assembly.
- During this month I had a conversation with Bishop Jaech to inform him of some of the happenings with the KLMA.
- Outreach/Engagement: Bethany, along with 5 other churches took out a full-page ad that ran 3x during Holy Week stating all were welcome and that we support diversity (LGBTQIA+). This has been part of our Evangelism.

<u>Life Balance</u>: Now that the second most busy season is over, pastor was encouraged to work on this. She did inform us that she holds the Sabbath very seriously and does not work on Mondays as her Sabbath day.

Unfinished Business:

- **Synod Assembly Report-** Pastor Susan, Bill Zimmerman, and substitute representative Beth Grambo all attended the synod assembly. It was a packed full, lively assembly of about 350. The presenters and video clips worked to provide a hopeful church message. The voting initiatives all passed with no controversy. The big news is that Allison Keys, Synod office administrator, is retiring after 19 years. She received a standing ovation for a job very well done!
- **Need Technology Help-** Pastor Susan will create a booklet of instructions to keep near the computer. John Pelster has been serving in this roll without help, and Worship/Music was concerned that there is no additional help running streaming technology. If needed and no new volunteers have been found the council may have to explore new options.
- Action Plan To Do's In order to make sure we keep working on our Action Plan activities, each section will be overseen by a council member: 1. Marketing0Beth G & Barb C; 2. Welcoming Statement-Pr. Susan; 3. Grandparent project-Phyllis; 4. Events of Interest-Tori Gosch; progress reports will be given at each meeting.
- Critical Action Next Steps-After considerable discussion, it was determined to continue to work on this with modifications. It was moved and seconded based on our 2023 Action plan to transform the Critical Action Plan to a three-year action plan that will sustain our future. Motion carried. Note: the council will continue to monitor our income and expenses and are prepared to make adjustments as needed.

New Business:

- **Volunteer Chair**-Pastor Susan has some names and is asking for a chair for this. She has received the process information and will train a new leader;
- **Pastor's Lay Sunday-**Since Pr. Susan gave up her fifth Sunday off for the guest, she has suggested June 18 instead.
