In both Confirmation and also in the Women's Bible Study the Ten Commandments have been studied. The Small Catechism gives extended viewpoints (as Jesus did) about what the commandments are. The Large Catechism (about 100 pages) expands even

further. It is a good book to read at some point (highly recommend). The Ten Commandments puts ground under our feet and gives us ways to live in community with each other. It would be lovely if everyone adhered to them, but the reality is that we all fall short of them (Romans 3:23), as people have done since the fruit was taken from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. People have struggled to keep the commandments long before Jesus entered the picture.

Jesus, however, upped the bar as far as the commandments are concerned. When asked which was the greatest commandment, "He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." (Matthew 22:37-40). In other words: Love God, Love Others.

It sounds so simple the way Jesus put it, but we still fall short. Love goes such a long way. It opens the doors for so many things. Start with telling Jesus that you love him and why (give thanks for all the beauty and wonders) and then throw some love into the world. Start pouring love into those that have been placed in front of you and then move out toward the world. Let us be the love that shines forth in this rainy world.

March Expense & Income Report-March 2023 budget expenses were \$12,071.08 and exceeded March 2023 budget income of \$6,438 by \$5,633.08. The Church loan balance is \$33294.13 and the Designated Funds balance is 38,369.43. This may seem smaller as we discovered an error in how the Misc. account was tallying. Before the Misc funds balance included accounts that were accounted for individually. That has now been corrected. YTD offerings of \$35,868.42 fell short of YTD expenses of \$37,365. March 2022 YTD budget offerings were \$34,356.00 and expenses were \$32,117.84.

Note: the ending balance does not reflect March's Building Payment. The one you see is for February. Since we our payments are automatic now, we don't get receipts of a payment (including Principal and Interest until we get the bank statement, so the payment is recorded on the following month. Kim did however update the Red Canoe page with the payment, principal and interest.

Emergency Fund-Thank you, Bethany, for your generous second mile giving. Total collected was \$199.00. After the 20% was added to the Pastor Discretionary Fund, a check for \$159.20 will be mailed to ELCA Lutheran World Relief fund.

She will combine all feedback & suggested goals and prepare for a meeting with Tori, Barb, and Pastor to get pastor's input and collaboratively draft goals for next year.

<u>Financial Review Policy</u> First Reading- Barb C Input was taken and moved to second reading.

Letter to Retirement Homes-Canterbury-Barb C It was modified and will be sent to Canterbury Park to start. For our outreach Action Plan, we are asking if they would like a monthly visit from pastor and members, a church service, communion, etc.

<u>Hungry Kids Grants (Price Foundation</u>)-Barb C Council agreed to continue to provide similar grants as possible.

Lions Recycling-George O. proposed we consider have a collection box near our recycling for members to place their paper products for recycling.
