Glimmers of Hope and Thanksgiving

May the God of your hope so fill you with all joy and peace in believing (through the experience of your faith) that by the power of the Holy Spirit, you may abound and be overflowing (bubbling over) with hope. Romans 15:13 (AMPC)

This month is Stewardship Month. This is the time we turn in pledge cards. They are really important in helping us to set the budget for next year.

Money is a tricky subject in the church, but as a non-profit, we count on your contributions for, well, everything. From salaries to taxes to electricity to any repair to this building, it all comes from your tithes and offerings. Yet, money remains a taboo subject in any church, but as the concept of tithing has almost disappeared, we have to ask. As we are in the process of selling the upper lot, asking becomes imperative and will remain so as the population of churches is changing.

This brings us back to hope. Hope in the Old Testament meant looking backward and knowing that God has helped you in the past, and so you know that God will help you now. Hope in the Old Testament meant trust in God. Hope in the New Testament means that we point to Jesus in a future not yet seen. We look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal (2 Corinthians 4:18). Hope in the New Testament means faith in God.

Throughout this month we will be talking about hope and what I call glimmers of hope. Many of the council members and anyone who attended the WELCA conference may already be familiar to what I am going to ask you to do.

I am going to ask you to start writing down the glimmers of hope that you see at Bethany and things about Bethany that you are grateful for. It is important to start cranking the hope gear and get it moving again.

In the book "The Hope Quotient" by Ray Johnston, the author says that if you can raise your hope meter by 10%, you can change the outcome of just about anything. You can test the theory on your health, weight, finances, depression level, etc. Ask yourself if your health moved up 10%, would that make a difference? If it moves down 10%, does that make a difference? How about if your weight goes down 10%? Would that make a difference? What if it goes up? Same with finances, same with depression, right? If you move up 10%, you might move above the line of depression, and if you move down, then you will be below it. And certainly, if we raised church finances (at least) by 10%, we would see a difference in the budget.

Sometimes, we think we need to change everything 100% and do it right away, but anyone who has tried to lose weight knows that it is one or two pounds at a time, and that is usually in a week, not in a day.

But still, 10% is not simple either. There is another book called "Atomic Habits" written by James Clear. This book teaches that it is the small habits that we can maintain and commit to propel us forward to achieve different things. Going back to the weight example, losing one or two pounds a week comes from following some kind of plan, making changes in your diet, and exercising more, but those things come from a commitment and finding a plan first-which are the two smaller things that can propel us forward.

I want us to start writing down these glimmers of hope and thanks-giving. Those are our small things...for now. It puts us back into the thinking-forward space of life, and we also stand in recognition of the grace that God has already bestowed on this amazing community. Each person who has entered these doors and each who will come will prayerfully find a community of believers ready to share the hope of Christ through service, prayer, and love. We want to be a church of the future. By the way, every pledge turned in, no matter what amount, is a glimmer of hope for the future of Bethany and something to be grateful for. Thank you for who you are and for all you do. We give God thanks and praise for each day and for the hope of Christ and the promises that we stand upon.
