



Dear Bethany,

One thing that really stands out about Bethany is the amount of time that goes into praying for others and those in the community. I know that if something hits the prayer chain, it will be covered in prayer by many, and the time we spend during service praying is of vital importance. I appreciate your dedication to intercessory prayer.

Jesus taught us to pray in different ways. Of course, there is the Lord's Prayer, but there are also verses in the Bible that say to stand in your closet and pray, there is the exact opposite, about praying boldly. Jesus himself went to the Mt. of Olives alone to pray. The point is not the how but that we take the time to lift one another in prayer.

In my mind, prayer is about communicating with God with honest emotions and giving your worries to God. We are not very good about giving our worries to God and leaving them in the Creator's hands; we usually take our worries back with us and put them back in our pockets to carry further, but in that prayer moment, we allow God to hold us.

I really like Anne LaMott's book "Help, Thanks, Wow: The Three Essential Prayers." She talks about arrow prayers, which are the one-word prayers you send up like "Help," and the other prayers, which are to be remembered when we are grateful for something (Thanks!) and when we appreciate what God has done (Wow—look at how you painted the sunrise this morning). I think sometimes we forget that praying can be simple. And like the verse in the beginning mentions, in the times when we cannot pray for ourselves, the Spirit will step in. And when someone cannot pray, that is also where we, the community, step in to lift someone up. I thank God often for the praying community of Bethany. Keep on.

HOW CAN YOU HELP BETHANY IF YOU ARE OVER 72 YEARS OLD?

What is a "required minimum distribution" (RMD), and why should I care about it?

An RMD is the smallest amount you must withdraw from your tax -deferred retirement accounts every year after a certain age. At some point in your life, you may have put money into tax-deferred retirement accounts, such as Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) and 401(k) workplace retirement accounts. The key word here is "tax-deferred." You postponed taxes on your contributions and earnings; however, if you directly have it go to the church and not come to you, you can avoid the taxes!

How Do You Do This? The amount changes each year, according to your age. Start by calculating how much you had in all your tax -deferred accounts as of December 31 of the previous year. Next, find your age on the IRS uniform lifetime table and the corresponding "distribution period." The distribution period is an estimate of how many years you'll be taking RMDs. If you're 73, for example, the distribution period is 24.7 years, based on your life expectancy. Then divide your balance by the distribution period. Let's say you have a combined \$100,000 in your tax-deferred retirement accounts: \$100,000 divided by 24.7 is \$4,049 — which is the amount you must withdraw. If you are in the 25 percent combined state and local tax bracket, you'll owe \$1,012 in taxes on your RMD.

Where Can I Take It From? You can take your RMD out of one account, or take bits from each one, so long as you withdraw the required minimum.

How Can I Help My Church? Have your investment person do a direct transfer to Bethany Lutheran Church, but make sure they put YOUR name on the paperwork. Then notify one of the Financial Secretaries so they can watch for it to arrive. This prevents you from having to pay taxes on the withdrawal.

Unfinished Business:

- Caldwell Banker Update-We have completed the Quick Claim Deed process with many thanks to Harry Blair! On Saturday night (March 27) we have received a firm offer for \$69,000 with a closing date of May 24th. It was moved and seconded to immediately sell Lot 8 & 14 Block 4, Monticello Acres WB Martins Addition to Longview to Thane and Kelly Riddle for \$69,000 as noted in the sale agreement contingent upon an earlier selling date (2 wks.). Motion carried. Barb C will meet with the realtor in the morning to start this process. (Note: We have asked for at least May 15 closing.) 




