Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom, you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. -Psalm 104: 24

Ahh fall. What a lovely season. It is the showcase of the Northwest with all our beautiful deciduous trees. And the warm weather fading into the first cooling air of the fall. It is time to find those cozy sweaters and enjoy the glory that erupts outside. Fall is a time of change, changing seasons, travel usually slows down, the children return to school and we know the weather will change.

In our faith lives, there are seasons as well. Some are in the summer season and some have hit a time of winter where things feel a little more dry.

During a particular season of dryness, a pastor friend of mine said these inspiring words, “Fake it ‘til you make it.” It seems like odd advice, but it was the best advice I could have been given then. My pastor meant I should open the Bible just as I have always done, continue to do the Bible study, and don’t stop; it will kick back in. That was exactly what happened. Having a time that is committed to God each day can help steady those waves that sometimes can be overwhelming. Having a dedicated prayer or study time can do wonders for your soul and be your boat in the rocky waves, a boat carved from the Word of God.

Developing a life habit of devotion can save you when the waves reach a tipping point. If that is a new idea, start by setting a timer, pick one book of the Bible you are curious about, and read it. Start with one minute, and move it to two in a week or so. It is amazing how far you can get. If you don’t know where to start, you can start at the beginning in Genesis. Or you can start in the New Testament in Matthew. My suggestion is to start with the book of John, and if you only read one book of the Bible, John is where Jesus reveals himself as God through a series of I AM statements. If you only read two books, then John and Romans, then Genesis, the Psalms, and Isaiah (My opinion of course.) Or just start somewhere. It is the Good Book, after all, and it is beautiful. I would love to hear the book of the Bible you treasure the most. Let me know.

- **Lot Update-** Sale pending with good offer! Pray! (Note-sold on Aug.21st!) We discussed a list of priorities for saving, loan pay off possibilities, and foundation opportunities—more later; **It was moved and seconded to remove the freeze on the budget. Motion carried.** (Note later-Committees may now spend their budgets!)
- **Columbia Heights Sign Update-**Sign moved and stored by shed; Thank you Randy Grambo!

September Emergency Fund

Family Community Resource Centers -Kelso and Longview (Homeless kids)

This month we help support our local preschool-twelfth grade students in need. Last year's count surveyed 271 people, with 71 unsheltered youth, 128 in emergency shelters and 72 in transitional housing. State law requires each county to conduct an annual homeless count, which Cowlitz County uses to see trends, rather than as an all-encompassing census. In addition to children who are unhoused, we have a very large population that couch surfs, resides in inexpensive hotels, abandoned vehicles, etc.

The Kelso and Longview School Districts provide housing for a Family Community Resource Center in their own district as well as one or two hired staff to maintain it. The entire rest of the FCRCs is provided by donations from groups and individuals in our community. By fall when the cupboards are bare and school is about to start, they will start providing food, clothing, and guidance to community resources. We have some undocumented immigrant families who don't sign up for community resources for fear of deportation--- the FCRCs also provide food for their families so the children do not starve. This is a great time to do second-mile giving to the children and youth in our community.

Youth & Service Committee

Many hands would make the work easier! Did you know that there are only four members of this committee currently? They guide Small Seeds with Pastor Susan, plan with school staff for the year, do a summer youth project with Family Promise, facilitate fall school supply distribution, collect for Thanksgiving and Christmas food cards for partner schools, do an angel tree, do a Valentine cookie activity with Col. Heights Elementary, and Mother's Day projects with both Lexington & Columbia Heights schools in the spring. *You do not have to have special skills* as experienced leaders who've worked with children for many years lead the work, but additional volunteers would make the load easier. If you feel called to work on any of these projects, please contact the Reistroffer's or Barb Clausen.
