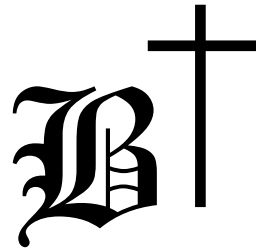

Dear Bethany,

The congregation voted to buy a new system with the related parts at our annual meeting. Now the challenge begins! As we await the quotations to determine how much we need, we would ask everyone to:

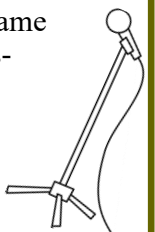
*replace giving to the building fund for the mortgage (now that its paid) by giving to the sound system in the designated funds;

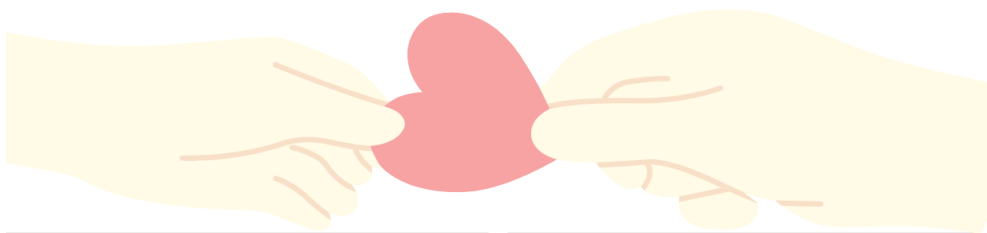

Lent comes from the Middle English word "lente," which means springtime. The early church started the tradition of Lent around the year 325, during the Council of Nicea, and it has been observed through the centuries by many Christian denominations.

Why is Lent 40 days? The number 40 is a significant number for Christians. Jesus spent 40 days in a desert. Noah had to wait 40 days for his ark to float. And Moses, along with his followers, traveled through the wilderness for 40 years before reaching the Promised Land.

Good Friday – Stations of the Cross Gallery

Calling all artsy types, Small Seeds and Sprouts, and spiritual type people. This year, Music and Worship talked about doing stations of the cross for Good Friday. I would like those who are interested to provide a “piece” that would go along with the station of the cross. It could be a poem, quilt, wood carving, pottery, something you have already, or a photograph; the following are the stations (technically, there are 14 stations; these are a combined version.) We will build this as we go. Good Friday is March 29. These need to be in by Palm Sunday (March 24).

1. Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane;
2. Jesus is betrayed by Judas, arrested, and condemned
3. Jesus is denied by Peter three times
4. Jesus is judged by Pilate and crowned with thorns;
5. Jesus takes up his cross, Simon of Cyrene helps him to carry his cross, and Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.
6. Jesus is crucified
7. Jesus promises the repentant thief he will be with him in paradise, and Jesus entrusts Mary and John to each other.
8. Jesus dies on the cross
9. Jesus is laid in the tomb.
