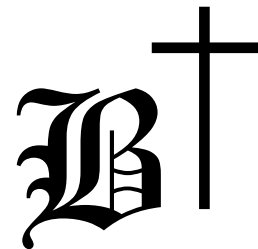

### **April Emergency Fund: Emergency Support Shelter**

The shelter serves abused men (off-site), women, and children of Cowlitz & Wahkiakum counties with a wide variety of programs, including counseling, medical help, safety planning, police/court services, victim compensation, and access to community resources. Victims of both domestic and sexually violent crimes are helped to escape from violence to hope. This month, our local support in the ER plate will help those in need. Thank you for your second mile giving!

### **Life Works & Duct Tape**

Sadly, our helper, Justin, has moved on after being with Bethany a year, and we are currently seeking a new helper. The council has authorized one hour a week every week at the recommendation of Duct Tape and the Life Works staff. This regularity will mean that some cleaning will be rotated every other week to meet our budget and help out our volunteers. We wish Justin well in his endeavors and thank him for his time here.

### **Designated funds:**

#### **Building, Capital Improvement and Sound System**

If you have been giving to Bethany's Building Fund, please change the wording to Capital Improvement. This fund pays for major improvements to the facility or to major equipment needed to run the church including deductibles, a new piece of kitchen equipment or for the new sound system.

There is also a designated fund specifically for the sound system. It is a costly project and the donated money will go towards the sound board, wiring, microphones, projector, etc. (Quotes for this project are currently being taken).

When the council settles on the authorization for this sound system project, we will use some of the money from the capital improvement, and the sound system account but there will be left over money in the Capital Improvement fund to cover emergencies.

## Lutherans Like to Eat!

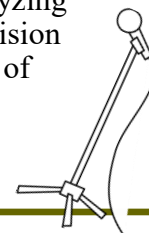

## Medical Teams International Lenten Offering

Current catchment population almost 6MM (5,941,855) as of today. Refugee & IDP catchment population – 2,843,666 and national catchment population 3,098,189 – these are the numbers of people that we have access to serve.

Last year 9.10MM catchment over the 6 countries. 2.3MM healthcare consultations. 292 health facilities. 523 nutrition sites. 94.5% cure rate among those treated for moderate or severe acute malnutrition in Ethiopia, Sudan & Uganda. 90% of children under 2 in Uganda, Tanzania & Ethiopia project areas are fully vaccinated for their age.

CHW (Community health workers) 2,374 and reaching 73,783 individuals in the countries we serve – Uganda, Tanzania, Ethiopia, Sudan, Ukraine, Colombia (and US)

Are all of our camps UN sanctioned? Medical Teams works in a variety of contexts globally. Some sites are refugee camps, others are refugee settlements, and sometimes we work in host community facilities or in community centers using mobile medical units. Wherever we work with refugees, we work together with UNCHR, as they are responsible for facilitating a safe environment. We do not run any camps, but help provide healthcare to refugees, internally displaced people, and local communities due to crises where external support is needed.

Who are our nutrition partners in camps? We directly implement nutrition projects in many locations, coordinating with WFP (World Food Program) for supplies where we can.

Do we have other major medical partners? We work with the Ministry of Health in the countries we operate, and have a few partners (other NGOs) who are able to program activities around disability, mental health, water and sanitation, and mobile medical units in contexts like Ukraine and Colombia. We have a partnership with Providence for our US dental programming. Wherever we work, we coordinate with the government and other actors who are providing similar services to ensure there is no overlap.

8. Jesus dies on the cross
