I have been pondering spiritual growth lately,
and what does that mean? For each person it
means something different. If you only come
to church on Sundays, then this will be an easy

exercise because there is so many places to go from there. And if you
already do more than just Sundays you have a good start.

Sundays are for coming together as a community of believers, to hear
the Word and participate in the Sacrament, and to pray and worship the
Lord together. By doing this in community, we strengthen one another to
be out in the world. It is like a seed being planted.

However, it helps to go beyond that. Having an active prayer life during
the week is the first step. Check in with yourself, do you pray at a certain
time each day? Or all the time? Or do you not think about it, and pray
only in church? Try finding a purposeful time. Can you add in a moment
of gratitude? Each day, take a moment to observe your surroundings and
identify three things or more for which you can express gratitude to God.
If there was one exercise that I would start with it is this one. Gratitude is
proven to be a mental health and spiritual health game changer.

Adding in some still and quiet time, can also do wonders. The easiest
way to start is to find one religious song that you like and light a candle
and try and just listen to the song without your mind wandering, Spotify
and YouTube have many songs and a simple search will help. You can
also find a classical instrumental of hymns if you don't want any words.
Being still can do many good things for your entire being, mind, body
and spirit. And of course, open the Bible and read the Word of God. If
you read one chapter a day it will take you 3 years. If you read 3 chapters
a day (suggestion: read one from the Old Testament, one Psalm/
Proverbs/ one from the New Testament) it will take about a year. You
can even get through the New Testament twice in that time. Summer is a
great time to start as we might have a little extra time with these
beautiful longer days. Let us grow in Christ together.

EMERGENCY FUND ~ JUNE

This month in our effort to support local needs, we ask you to consider supporting the new youth shelter for unhoused youth, called Beth's Place. This program located at the old Carriage House on 12th has room for up to 40 youth. It has a commercial kitchen and it is the hope that eventually the youth can be trained and with health cards can have employment. Currently, youth are required to get/stay clean from addictions, attend regular counseling with goals, be in attendance in an educational program, and work to be employed. Volunteers are still needed to help with some remodeling, developing a back (fenced patio area), etc. The facility has been well supported by many community groups, but they do need food. They have Christin volunteering from Zesty Chef catering designing dinner meals and training with one student working beside her to learn each night. They have grab and go for breakfast and if they are available, for lunch. We have a food drive for non-perishables June 1-4 in the Fellowship Hall, and after that time would appreciate your Emergency Donations with Beth's Place in the memo made out to the church—it will help purchase perishable foods.

Devotions and Prayer – Pastor Susan led us in prayer;

Call to Order and President's Report – Barb Clausen called the meeting to order at 3:03.

Decisions made between council meetings: Authorized transfer of monies from the former Building Fund \$3,730, the Capital Improvement Fund \$3,293, and the Thrivent Fund \$ 896 to help pay for the down payment of \$11,000 for the sound system to Sound Design NW. Authorized by consensus repair of the lawn mower not to exceed \$200. 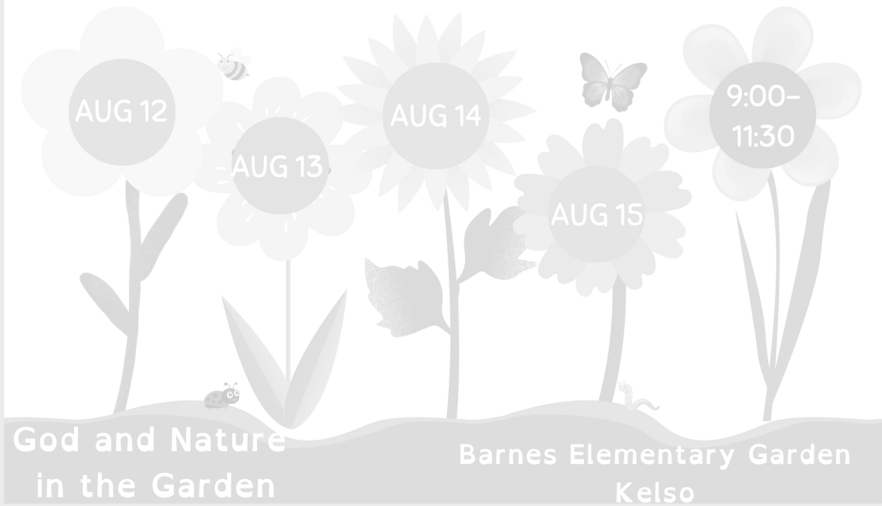
