

Greetings Bethany, In mid-June I attended the Synod Assembly, as there was a bishop election, the entirety of

the assembly was all business. It took all five votes to elect a bishop, and it was an exciting process. Many have asked how electing a bishop occurs. There were five scheduled votes. The first vote was general, everyone could nominate any ordained clergy, even if they were from another synod. In the first vote sixteen people were nominated.

From there those people had about an hour to either take their name out of the running, or quickly fill out forms to keep their name in. After that, we voted on seven candidates. Three people were new, and four people had been campaigning for longer times. This vote left seven people on the ballot.

On the second day, all seven people had a chance to give a four-minute speech. We voted again, which left us with the top three. Each person then answered three questions. I don't remember all the questions but there was one that was something to the effect of "Tell us about a time when you really felt the Holy Spirit enter into your ministry." When our newly elected bishop talked about how the Holy Spirit entered his ministry, was also when I felt the Holy Spirit enter into the room like a powerful energy. It brings goosebumps to my arms still. After this we had two candidates left, and in our 5th vote, our new bishop was elected. I thought it was an interesting and exciting process.

Our newly elect bishop is Rev. Keith Marshall from Enumclaw, WA. I told him in the receiving line what I had experienced, and he said, there were many people who had told him the same thing. It was a "Wow!" moment for sure. I love when things like this happen, and it is so powerful. There are just times when you know that the Spirit is present. I have had several experiences where this has occurred. In this time it was a woosh of an energy, but I have seen the Spirit come in a butterfly, felt it in an electric zap, and also in the stillness. I would love to hear your stories

Please extend prayers to Bishop Elect Reverend Keith Marshall as he is coming into such a time as this. May God be with us all.

Please consider even sharing the load others are carrying. We need 1-2 people to take turns opening the church on Sunday mornings—see Russ Gilchrist for what it involves.



Here is a spiritual practice for the month of July: Stillness

Try to spend quiet time stilling your mind. If you have never done this, set your timer for 30 seconds and the next day a minute and then a minute and a half. Try and get to 15 minutes by the end of the month. If you are not new to this practice try and get to 20 minutes at least once a day, and if you are already an expert and can do this easily, try adding in a second meditation in the evenings.

Pro tip: Mornings are the best time for a meditation but anytime works.

Why do this: Aside from the long list of health and mental health reasons that a quick Google search will bring up, spiritually it gives you space. Space from all the distractions out there. Space in your heart and your mind to hear God, to feel God. It can help calm your anxiety or your fears.

- 1. Turn off cell phone sound, (but you can set your timer) you can do this by setting the Do not Disturb button on your phone settings (don't forget to turn it back on afterward). And also you can set your alarm to vibrate so that it isn't so jarring.
- 2. You can say a prayer of beginning for openness and stillness, and a thanksgiving prayer for the time with the Lord at the end.
- 3. If your mind wanders, use a mantra word, like "peace" or "love" or "quiet" that you say over and over in your mind to bring you back to the stillness.
- 4. Keep a journal near by and write down any thing at the end.

Try it. Let me know your results. Pastor Susan


