- Other: The new presiding bishop of the ELCA was elected.
- ♦ Goal/Action Plan Progress Report: 2025-2026: To strengthen our spiritual growth so that God's promises come alive & Christ's love is shared with others. Summer Events- 7/16-4 guest, 12 total; 7/23- 1 guest, 10 total:

Unfinished Business:

- Church Mutual/Brotherhood Insurance: We budgeted \$6,000. Church Mutual annual payment would be \$6,200. There is a separate for wind and hail now with a \$25,000 deductible. The amount covered would be \$2,224,400. The portable no longer has liability only coverage.) Brotherhood annual payment would be \$5.902 for \$2,000,000 and this includes the portable and includes wind and hail. With the broadened coverage, it would put the total limit to \$2,500,000. Ginger recommends we go with Brotherhood. It was moved and seconded to approve Brotherhood as our insurance carrier for 2025 beginning this month. Motion carried.
- Lower Columbia Lutheran Conferences-Cancelled August Meeting. Received check from dissolution of checking account for \$93.55. Recommend Youth/Service Committee fund. Consensus to move to the Y/S fund.
- Endowment Committee-Pastor and Phyllis have signed and Susan is submitting the \$25,000 to set it up as per the congregation's decision. (Note: ELCA has approved & in process of submitting our \$25,000 starter as per then congregational vote.)
- **Sound System Report**-working on a list of minor adjustments, but everyone loves it! Cost to complete the Fellowship Hall is \$23,350.42- (This quote is from March and may need readjusted) The cost of the previously purchased speakers has been subtracted.
- **Special Congregational Meeting Minutes-**Postponed the draft of the minutes from June 1 meeting;
- Clipboard Volunteer Sign Ups-Council members signed up to encourage members for the weekly service opportunities;
- **Fire/Safety Security Plan-**Pastor Susan will be conducting a fire drill one Sunday and a lock down on a different occasion;
- Annual Reviews-Read reviews and goals. Goals for next year for Ginger -Continue to learn Power Church software and work on re-developing the website (with help); Dorothy-Continue to build the music team and create additional opportunities for youth; Thank you to both of these team members for sharing the gifts and enhancing our church life! You are appreciated. It was moved and seconded to approve the goals as reviewed. Motion carried.
