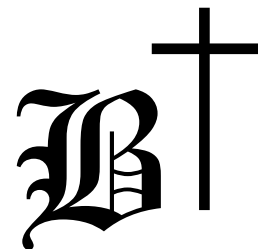

God Is Love. Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. 1 John 4:7

Dear Bethany,

In a month where love is supposed to be celebrated, where hearts and chocolate candies are shared, we are also dealing with very disturbing news, and images of terrible things especially in Minneapolis. Racism, hatred and fear are highly visible and yet Jesus tells us to love our neighbors as ourselves.

Jesus didn't clarify what a neighbor looked like, what race they were, economic status, whether foreign born or even what religion someone was. We are reminded of that powerful fact in the parable of the Good Samaritan. The people who would have been considered a neighbor walked by on the other side of the road. The Samaritan was the least likely to ever be considered a neighbor to the injured man, and yet that was the one who was a neighbor.

Today, the opposite of anything we would hope for any neighbor is happening. We see children being taken, and people, regardless of citizen status, violently being taken from their homes. This isn't about deportation, it is about humanity. And people are being treated anything but humane. It's awful. And scary.

In a recent email from Bishop Keith, he spoke to the violence and dehumanization that is happening in our country. This is a quote from his letter:

"In this moment, I invite you to guard your hearts and minds from the violence and hate. Do not blind yourself to it, nor ignore it, hoping it will simply go away. Rather, I invite you to follow the way of Christ: praying for all who grieve, naming injustice wherever it occurs, and refusing to let fear, anger, or ideology eclipse our calling to love our neighbor, to stand with the marginalized, and to bear faithful witness to the gospel."

So how do we do it? How do we keep our hearts and minds filled with love, compassion, and kindness instead of hatred and anger? We need to keep turning to Christ. We need to love fiercely and hold on to Jesus and let his light shine through and keep praying for our definition of neighbor to equal that of Christ.

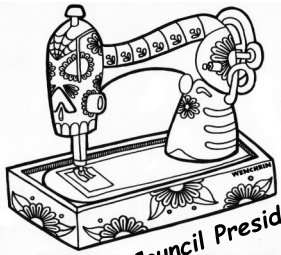

Emergency Fund for February

“This month, as we continue our mission to support local needs, we invite you to join us in caring for a very special program, Beth’s Place, a youth shelter for unhoused young people.

Located in the historic Carriage House on 12th, Beth’s Place provides a safe and welcoming home for up to 40 youth. The facility includes a commercial kitchen, and the hope is that, over time, youth will be able to gain valuable job training and certification to help them build a brighter future.

Participants commit to staying free from addictions, attending regular counseling, setting personal goals, pursuing education, and working toward employment.

We’re grateful to have Christin from Zesty Chef Catering volunteering to design nutritious dinners and train one student each evening. Breakfasts and grab-and-go lunches are also offered when possible.

Together, we can make a meaningful difference in the lives of these young people, offering not just meals, but hope, stability, and the promise of a new beginning.

PLTS has a wonderful set of 6-week online asynchronous courses **scheduled for 2026** on topics related to **Racial Justice and Faith**.

These classes are **designed for anyone** - clergy or lay, any age, any identity, any level of church involvement. No undergraduate degree is required. The cost is only **\$250 per course** (with group and PLTS alumni discounts), and upon completion of four courses, one will receive a Certificate in Racial Justice and Faith from PLTS.

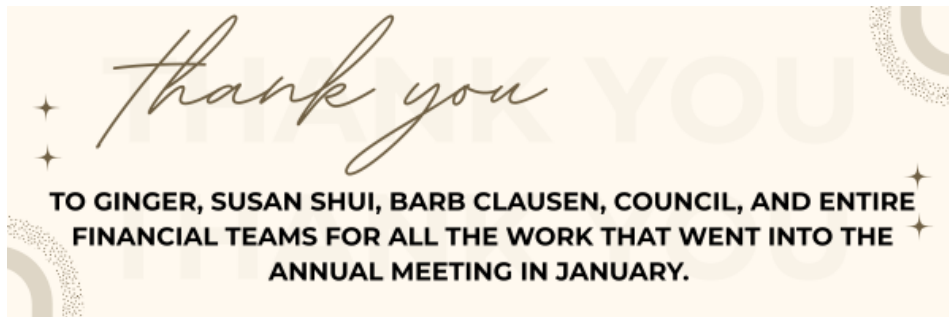
